## NATIONAL SEMINAR ON FOOD PROCESSING



National seminar on "Emerging technologies in Food Processing and ensuring Food safety" was organized by TNAU, on 16 and 17.10.2007 in connection with the "World Food Day". Dr.C.Ramasamy, Vice-Chancellor,

TNAU, while inaugurating the seminar highlighted that 820 million people in the developing world still suffer undernourishment and stressed that ensuring food security is not only a pre-requisite for sustainable development but also
for economic growth and entrepreneurship development.

In the National seminar, 320 participants from 12 colleges have registered. About 110 papers were presented in the technical sessions on Food safety and quality, Food engineering \& management and Innovative methods in food processing. About 58 posters and 12 models have been displayed in the poster and model sessions. A quiz programme for the student participants of various colleges has been held. A food festival was organized as part of this programme with 35 food items. On $17^{\text {th }}$ October 2007, the plenary session was presided over by Dr. A. Sampathrajan, Dean (Engg.) and Dr. M. V. Ranghasamy, Director, Water Technology Centre, TNAU, Coimbatore distributed certificates and prizes for winners of best technical paper, poster, quiz, models etc. and delivered the valedictory address.
