FARMERS' DAY

A focused interaction session was held in which, the scientists highlighted the latest developments in
agriculture and allied fields and also answered the queries of the farmers.

About 1374 candidates were called for counseling and nearly 870 candidates were admitted to different courses and colleges. Students were given a free hand to select the course and college. A single window system was followed in the first phase of counseling.

He emphasized the economic use of water for optimum production by following water saving techniques especially drip and fertigation. During the training programme, various topics pertinent to dry farming were dealt. Scientists of TNAU were using interactive and participatory mode of teaching. Field visit and discussion with successful watershed farmers were arranged to impart hands on training on watershed management. The participants were assisted to prepare 'Action Plan' for their respective districts based on their experience and latest improved technologies learnt from this programme.

TRAINING ON VERMI COMPOST AT KVK, VAMBAN


Dr. V. Muralidharan, Director, TRRI inaugurated the training on "Commercial production of vermicompost" at KVK , Vamban on
21.6.2007. In his presidential address, he reiterated that instead of blanket application of chemical fertilizers, a soil test based fertilizer application along with organic manures would be the right choice to maintain and improve the soil health as well as for the better marketability of the farm produce. A large number of practicing farmers, rural youths and SHG women were participated and benefitted out of this programme.

## TRAINING ON HYBRID SEED PRODUCTION IN BHENDI

One day training on "Seed production in Yellow vein mosaic resistant hybrid bhendi" was organized by the Department of Vegetable crops, HC\&RI, Coimbatore on 27.6.07 at the University orchard, TNAU, Coimbatore. Dr.D.Veeraragavathatham, Dean (Hort) addressed the farm women and explained the advantages of hybrids. The farm women were given hands on training in hybrid seed production in bhendi demonstration plot in the orchard. The procedure of emasculation in flower buds of female parent was demonstrated and the farm women were allowed to practice the same since, this is the most skillful part of hybrid seed production.

TRAINING ON INDIGENOUS POULTRY MANAGEMENT

A training on "Indigenous poultry management" was organized at


KVK, Madurai on 19.6.2007 in which 20 women belongs to five self help groups of Madurai district were participated. Dr.S.Kumar, Professor and Head, KVK, Madurai welcomed the gathering. The presidential address was delivered by Dr.K.Ramamoorthy, Dean, Agricultural College and Research Institute, Madurai. At the end of the session, 20 giriraja chicks for each self help group were distributed in the ratio of one male and four female for conducting the Frontline demonstration on the same.

## RELEASE OF NEW IMPLEMENT

The Agricultural Engineering College and Research Institute, Kumulur has released the new implement 'Stump remover' on the eve of Farmers' day in the presence of Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture Th. Veerapandi S. Arumugam on 23.6.2007 at TNAU, Coimbatore. The stump remover can be operated by tractors with 35 hp and above. It removes the roots of dry land weed crops like Moringa tinctoria and Prosophis juliflora, by wedge action of the tool. The cost of the implement is Rs.10,500/-.
