TNAU NSS Special Camp Launched at Sokkanur

National Service Scheme special camp was inaugurated at Sokkanur Panchayat near Kinathukadavu on 23-5-2015. A total of 336 volunteers comprising of 243 girls and 93 boys along with programme officers participated. In the morning session, the adopted villages were surveyed by the volunteers for map preparation and also distributed the brochures and created awareness about the camp program.

The formal inaugural function of the National Service Scheme Special Camp started by 5.00 pm in the school premises at Sokkanur village. Around 100 farmers participated in this capm.

Introductory speech about the camp was delivered by Dr. K. Kumutha, NSS Program coordinator.

Mrs. Mani Sivamurugesan, President, Sokkanur panchayat, Mrs. Poongodi Kandasamy, Councillor, Sokkanur Panchayat and Mrs. Vennila Nataraj, Vice-President, Sokkanur Panchayat offered felicitations on the occasion.

Sathyapriya, II B.Sc Agri followed by the felicitation of Mrs.Vennila Natraj (Vice-President, Sokkanur Panchayat)
