Weather Based Agro-Advisories: Important Crops: Jasmine & (Animal husbandry)

Prevailing hot weather condition there are incense of Leaf Webber in Jasmine. This caterpillar built elaborate network of webbing of leaves, especially in the lower portion causing severe injury. Caterpillar feeds on the leaves by scrapping the chlorophyll. The infestation severe in terminal shoots during dry and sunny weather. To control this, collect and destroy the damaged leaves along with larvae. Use light trap to attract and kill the adult moths. Spray 5% of Neem seed extract or Malathion 50EC 2ml/lts. Properly prune and maintain the field hygienically.

During the summer season, snails, germs and larvae found in the dry pond water can cause health damages to the cattle, so farmers are advised, not to allow their cattle to drink water from dry / dirty water ponds.
