Weather forecast for next five days (01.05.2021 to 05.05.2021)

According to district level forecast issued by India Meteorological Department for Perambalur district, the sky will be partly cloudy. No rainfall is expected coming next 5 days. Maximum temperature is expected to be around 40 °C and Minimum temperature is expected to be 27 °C. Morning relative humidity is expected to be around 75 percent and evening relative humidity is expected to be around 35 percent. Average wind speed is expected to be around 8 km per hour and the wind direction will be South.

Agro-meteorological Advisory

• Farmers are advised to go for summer irrigated pulse cultivation during this Chithiraipattam (April-May). Suitable varieties in blackgram are ADT 5, VBN 5, VBN 6, VBN 8 and in greengram are VBN 2 and VBN 3.

- Summer ploughing can be done by utilizing the rainfall expected upcoming days and to control weeds and larva of insects.
- Raising of green manure crops like daincha, sunnhemp and kolinji can be done to utilizing the summer rainfall.
- Highly reflective aluminum roofs may be provided to cattle shed to reduce the heat stress to the cattle underneath.
