Forecast for next five days: 13.07.2022 to 17.07.2022

- → Light rain is likely to occur on 16th and 17th July.
- → Thunderstorm with lightning is likely to occur at one or two places on 13th and 14th July.
- During next five days, the sky will be cloudy. The temperature range is expected to be around 25°C - 34°C. Relative humidity range is expected to be around 70-80%. The wind speed is expected to be 12 km per hour and the wind will be mostly from south west direction.
- Rainfall (2.42 mm) will be below normal, maximum temperature (31.48°C) and minimum temperature (24.87°C) will be normal from 17th to 23rd July.

Weather based Agro-Advisories.

Crop	Stage/Particulars	Agro Advisory					
Sugarcane	Tillering phase	To control shoot borer in sugarcane, soil application of Cartaphydrochloride 4G 10 kg/hectare may be done.					
Brinjal	Flowering Stage	To manage Brinjal shoot borer, apply neem cake 200 kg/ha or spray Emamectin Benzoate 4% SG@ 0.4 g/l.					
Cassava	Vegetative stage	To control Red mite in cassava, apply Pongamia oil 500 ml/ha or spray Propargite 750 ml and Sulphur 1250 g/ ha.					

SMS: Light rain is expected during next few days. Hence, farmers may postpone irrigation.
