SMS Advisory Chances of Moderate rain 9, 10 Sep & light rain during 11, 12, 13 Sep. Maximum temperature would be in the range of 32°C to 34°C and the minimum temperature would be between 22°C - 24°C. Cloudy sky will appear for the next five days. Wind expected with the speed of 12-14 Kmph from, West & Northwest directions.

# **General Advisory:**

Extended range Forecast for next week (08<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> Sep 2023):

# Rainfall:

As per extended range predictions, there is possibility of slightly above normal rainfall likely over the district during  $08^{th}$  to  $014^{th}$  September 2023.

As per extended range predictions, there is possibility of near normal rainfall likely over the district during 15<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> September 2023.

## **Maximum Temperature:**

Maximum temperatures is likely to be generally near normal and are likely to be in the range 26°C to 32°C over the plains of the district during next week. 08<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> September 2023.

# **Minimum Temperature:**

Minimum temperatures are likely to be generally near normal and are likely to be in the range 18°C to 26°C over the district during next week 08<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> September 2023.

Heavy rain is likely to occur at one or two places over the district during 9& 10 September 2023. Farmers are advised to act swiftly to repair the water channels, farm ponds and other water bodies to harvest the rain water. During these days farmers are advised to avoid irrigation, intercultural operations and application of plant protection measures to the standing crops, provide adequate drainage facilities in the fields to avoid water stagnation due to heavy rainfall, do not allow the animals to grazing outside, standing near the trees or electric poles & provide safe shelter.

Wind with the speed of 12 to 14 kmph is expected for the next five days. Hence farmers are advised to provide propping in sugarcane and to provide adequate support for crops like Banana, Papaya, Guava and Moringa, to prevent from lodging. For Gourds check the structures /pandhals for damages in the strings and poles and provide adequate support. Postpone the spraying activity.

# Weather Based Agro-Advisories: (Brinjal, Mango & Animal Husbandry).

### Brinjal:

Due to the current weather, the incidence of spotted beetles may affect the Brinjal crop. The symptoms of damage are found in leaves.

The beetles scrap the chlorophyll. It leads to skeletonization and drying of leaves.

To control collect the damaged leaves with grubs, and egg masses and destroy them.

Spray Cartaphydrochloride @ 35gm per tank. Plant protection activities can be done, only on non-rainy days.

### Mango:

Mango cultivators are advised to manage the canopy in Mango groves.

Remove the rootstock sprouts and low-lying branches nearer to the ground to facilitate easy cultural operations.

Remove overlapping, inter-crossing, diseased, dried and weak branches in old trees to get good sunlight and aeration.

Retain two healthy shoots by trimming away the weak shoots among the crowded terminal shoots during the months of August-September, annually.

# Animal Husbandry:

Due to the prevailing weather, external parasites may attack your goats and sheep.

If symptoms are found, to protect your livestock from these external parasites, mix 2ml of Butox with one litre of water and apply the solution to the outer body of the sheep.

This medicine should not be used internally.
