Weather Summary and forecast for Thiruvavarur district

According to district level forecast issued by India Meteorological Department for Thiruvavarur district, the sky will be moderately cloudy. Light rainfall expected on 10.08.2024 to 14.08.2024. Maximum temperature is expected to be around 32 - 35 °C and minimum temperature is expected to be around 23 - 26 °C. Morning relative humidity is expected to be around 70 - 80 percent and evening relative humidity is expected to be around 40 - 50 percent. Average wind speed is expected to be around 12 - 18 km per hour. The wind direction will be south south west.

Crop	Stage	Advisory
General		Farmers are advised to provide adequate drainage facilities to all crops due to light to moderate rainfall forecast.

		Link the drainage channel with farm ponds towards efficient water drainage besides the rain water storage.
		Avoid application of fertilizers and insecticides to the crops.
Cotton	Harvest	Pick the matured cotton boles before rain.
Banana		Provide support with wooden poles to avoid lodging of tree due to rain and wind.
Sugarcane		To avoid lodging due to heavy rain, detrashing and propping of five month old sugarcane is recommended.
Cattle	Cow and Goat	Exposure of calves and kids to rain should be avoided to prevent from pneumonia attack in view of expected high rain.

Farmers are advised to provide adequate drainage facilities to all crops due to light to moderate rainfall forecast.
