Vice Chancellor inspected 'Thane' damages in VRS, Palur

Our Honourable Vice Chancellor, Dr. P. Murugesa Boopathi, Dr. T. Jayaraj, Director, TRRI, Aduthurai and Dr. P. Kalaiselvan,



DEE visited Thane cyclone affected places at VRS, Palur on 12.1.2012 and 13.01.2012. They witnessed the severe damages caused on buildings, perennial tree crops and other economically important trees, different seed crops *viz.*, paddy, blackgram, sunhemp and vegetable seed crops and ongoing research trials by 'Thane' cyclone which hit on 30.12.2011 with wind velocity of more than 125 kmph. He inspected the very old Mangalore tiled roof buildings. Rupees 50 lakhs sanctioned as immediate relief fund for the construction of new Administrative building. In addition to this, he also sanctioned a sum of Rupees 15 lakhs to construct compound wall and 25 lakhs for repairing of all damaged buildings.

Our Vice Chancellor recommended to

use shredder to powder the fallen leaves and twigs for making compost. He also suggested to clean all the damaged trees without disturbing the grafts and seedlings and to utilize fallen teak trees for making laboratory stools and shelves for office use. He advised to use Chain belt type harvestor to harvest the lodged rice crop during the field visit and suggested to take up sunhemp sowing after the harvest of Paddy.
