NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON SPICES AND AROMATIC CROPS (SYMSAC- VIII 2015)



A National symposium on Spices and Aromatic Crops (SYMSAC – VIII) was jointly organized by Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore and Indian Society for Spices, Kozhikode with the theme “Towards 2050- Strategies for Sustainable Spices Production” during 16th -18th December 2015 at Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore. Dr.K. Nirmal Babu, President, ISS, Kozhikode delivered the Welcome Address. The symposium was inaugurated by Dr. N. K. Krishna Kumar, Deputy Director General (Horticultural Science), ICAR, New Delhi who stressed the need for higher productivity, clean spices through improved post harvest processing, packaging and storage systems for sustainable spices production. Dr. K. Ramasamy, Vice-Chancellor, TNAU delivered the Presidential Note and affirmed that both agricultural and horticultural sectors provide opportunities for alternate systems of medicine and suggested that studies may be entrusted towards indication of maturity index and right time of harvest that may have positive effect on the alternate systems of medicine. Prof.R. R. Hanchinal, Chairperson, PPV&FRA, New Delhi in his Key Note Address appreciated Tamil Nadu Agricultural University for its systematic work on protecting the varieties of this region.

Tribal Farmers Training on Biological Control of Crop Pests



Two tribal farmers' trainings were conducted respectively at Bargur hills, Anthiyur, Erode district on 3.2.2016 and at Pokkapuram, Gudalur, Nilgiris district on 6.2.2016 with ICAR – AICRP – Biological control of crop pests funds under Tribal sub plan. Sixty tribal farmers benefitted by the training program. The use of biofertilizers, entomophages, entomopathogens and antagonists to check pest and diseases and for better crop production were explained to the tribal farmers through lectures and demonstrations. The training of tribal farmers at Bargur hills focused on organic ragi cultivation where as the tribals of pokkapuram village addressed the nutritional security through kitchen garden with bio inputs for production and protection of vegetables. The Bargur tribal farmers were supplied with biofertilizers like Azospirillum (1Kg), Phosphobacteria (1kg), Pseudomonas fluorescens (1kg), Beauveria bassiana (1kg), Metarhizium anisopliae (1 kg), Neem oil (500 ml), Panchkavya (1lt), One sticky trap, sticker solution, ragi seeds

(3 kgs) and vegetable seeds like bitter melon, bottle gourd, bhendi, Amaranthus, cluster bean and garden lablab were distributed to the Pokkapuram tribal farmers. The farmers were also demonstrated on the use of biocontrol agents like Trichogramma, Chrysoperla and Cryptolaemus montrouzieri. The tribal trainings were organized with the help of MYRADA KVK, Erode and UPASI KVK, Coonoor which serve Erode and Nilgiris district, respectively. Dr. T.Manoharan, Professor and Head, Department of Agricultural Entomology, Dr.S.Sridharan, Professor and Dr.P.A.Saravanan Assistant Professor organized the training programme.

One Day Training on Mass - production of Biocontrol Agents



The first one day paid training on Mass-Production of Bio control Agents to farmers was conducted on 11.02.2016 under Venture Capital Scheme at the department of Agricultural Entomology, TNAU, Coimbatore. Thirteen farmers (12 Male +1 Female) representing Coimbatore, Tiruppur, Salem and Thirunelveli districts attended the training programme. The training programme was inaugurated by Dr.K.Ramaraju, Director (CPPS). Dr.P.Murugesan, Director, Agri Business Development and Dr.T.Manoharan, Professor and Head, Department of Agricultural Entomology also spoke on the occasion. The farmers were exposed to the natural enemies of crop pests. They were shown the live and preserved specimens of natural enemies of crop pests and were taken to the Biocontrol laboratory to show mass production techniques of egg parasitoids, larval parasitoids, coccinellids and green lacewing predators. The farmers were subsequently given hands on training in mass culturing of coccinellids with red pumpkin, preparation of cumbu grain medium for Corcyra culture and carding of Corcyra eggs for parasitization by Trichogramma. The farmers had interaction with

the scientists besides the feedback received from the farmers. The farmers registered for the training were provided with a kit containing soft copy of production procedures of Biocontrol agents, technical manual, Biocontrol Agents worth Rs.50/- and a pouch with certificate for attending the training. The programme was organised by Dr.S.Sridharan, Professor, Dr.P.A.Saravanan, Assistant Professor and Dr.R.Philip Sridhar, Professor in the Department of Agricultural Entomology.

Field Day on Cotton High Density Planting

A field day on Development of compact genotype in cotton, suitable for high density planting system and mechanical harvest under Tamil Nadu Cotton Cultivation Mission was conducted on 18.02.2016 at Cotton Research Station (CRS), Veppanthattai, Perambalur District in which 73 farmers from four blocks of Perambalur district participated and benefited. Dr.R.Kavimani, Professor and Head, CRS Welcomed the gathering. Th. P. Chandran, Joint Director of Agriculture, Perambalur presided over the programme. Dr. P.Amala Balu, Professor and Head, Department of Cotton, TNAU, Coimbatore briefed about current cotton varieties/ hybrids and technologies recommended for cultivation in Tamil Nadu. Dr. M.Gunasekaran, Professor and Head, Cotton Research Station, Srivilliputtur narrated the current scenario of cotton cultivation, importance of cotton high density planting, advantages of multipurpose tractor drawn implement in carrying out intercultural operations, special features of cotton advance culture TCH 1819 and its suitability for high density planting systems. Th. S.Ayyasamy, Deputy Director of Agriculture, Th.J.Kathiravan, Programme Coordinator, Hans Roever Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Perambalur also spoke on the occasion. A demonstration on intercultural operation using multipurpose tractor drawn implement and use of battery operated cotton picker were also done for the benefit of farmers.
