69th 'Republic Day' celebrated at TNAU



The 69th Republic Day was celebrated on 26.01.2018 at Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore.Dr. K. Ramasamy, the Honourable Vice-Chancellor, TNAU was received by Dr.S.Mahimairaja, Dean (Agriculture), TNAU. The Vice-Chancellor hoisted the National Flag and delivered Republic Day Address. In his address, he mentioned the successful implementation of Innovative technologies in Agriculture that transformed India into a self sufficient country in-spite of the increasing population. Awards and prizes were distributed to the students who excelled in academic and sport activities. The Vice Chancellor inspected the NCC contingents lead by Capt. K.M.Sellamuthu, NCC Officer. All University Officers, Heads of Department, NCC Officers, NCC cadets NSS Co-ordinator, NSS Programme Officers, NSS volunteers, staff members participated in the Republic Day celebrations. A cultural event was also performed by the Under Graduate students.

Training programme on Maize Production Technology



Maize Research Station (MRS), Vagarai organized an off - campus training programme on 27.12.2017 at Pattiakadu tribal village, Kodaikanal Taluk under ICAR -Tribal Sub-Plan scheme 2017-18. Dr. K. Sethuraman, Professor and Head, MRS, Vagarai welcomed the gathering. Dr. R. Ravikesavan, Professor (Maize), Department of Millets, TNAU, Dr. Mohammed Amanullah, Professor (Agronomy) and Dr. N. Kumari Vinodhana, Assistant Professor (Plant Breeding and Genetics) took technical classes. The tribal farmers were distributed with the farm tools viz., Hand sprayers, Spades and Hand hoes and eight kilogram of TNAU maize hybrid CO 6 seeds for one acre of land along with Bio-fertilizers and Biopesticides. About 50 tribal farmers participated in the programme.

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On campus Fodder Cultivation training at Vamban



On campus training on Fodder cultivation was conducted at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Vamban, Pudukkottai on 28.12.2017. Dr. M.R. Latha, Programme Co-ordinator inaugurated the training programme. Dr. G. Prabukumar explained the Fodder production technologies and the farmers were exposed to mixed fodder bank demonstration unit maintained at KVK, Vamban. The farmers were told to have mixed fodder bank in their fields including cereal, legume under tree fodders to cater to the nutritional needs of their cattle. About 30 farmers participated and benefitted through this training.

Training to Veterinary Assistant Surgeons

Training was imparted to 200 Veterinary Assistant Surgeons (VAS) covering all the districts of Tamil Nadu for three days in four batches of (50 VAS in each batch) under State Fodder Development Scheme (2017-18) on 'Improved varieties and technologies in forage crops'.
