SYSTEM OF RICE INTENSIFICATION -'HARVEST MELA'

To create awareness on 'SRI' technique of rice cultivation among the farmers and to make them conscious on the increased productivity through SRI, 'Harvest Mela' was organized on 10.1.08 at Vikaravandi of Varahandhi sub basin of Villupuram District under TN-IAMWARM project.

Dr.C.Ramasamy, Vice-chancellor, TNAU accompanied with Mr. Audiseshiah Secretary PWD; Mr. Vibu Nayar, Project Director, IAMWARM Project; District collector Mr. Brajendra Navnit and Dr.M.V.Ranghaswamy, Director (WTC) & Nodal Officer (TN-IAMWARM), visited the demonstration plot and observed the standing paddy crop grown with System of Rice Intensification technology. Later in the presence of statistical officers, farmers and dignitaries, the field was ear marked and harvested, which was 7875 kg/ha of paddy as compared to normal yield of 4650 kg/ha through conventional method of cultivation. So far, 3,000 ha had come under the technology. It is being promoted under the mission mode to make it 11 lakh ha, in the next two or three years. The Vice – Chancellor stated that as a measure of popularizing essential implements for SRI like cono weeder, marker etc., rural artisans are being trained by TNAU and also local manufacturing of these implements are encouraged. It is proposed to distribute 10,000 cono weeders free of cost to the farmers.

ALTERNATE CROP IN THE FARMING SYSTEM

With the objective of conserving water and utilizing it efficiently with less men hours and fetching higher monetory return to the farming community of Villupuram district, TNAU has introduced thornless bamboo as one of the alternate crops in the Villupuram district. Mr. Audiseshiah, PWD Secretary, Dr. C. Ramasamy, Vicechancellor, TNAU; Mr. Vibu Nayar, Project Director, IAMWARM, District collector Mr. Brajendra Navnit and Dr. M. V.Rangaswamy, Director (WTC) & Nodal Officer

(TN-IAMWARM), inspected the thornless bamboo planted field at Mathurthirukai, and also declared open the drip irrigation system. Problems on intercropping, weed management, organic recycling and harvesting techniques were discussed.

Under the DBT funded scheme on palmyrah, two hands on training programmes were conducted, one at Bodipalayam village of Pollachi taluk on 28.12.2007 and second at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, TNAU, Coimbatore on 02.01.2008. In first programme at Bodipalayam village, about 100 neera tappers participated and got trained on value addition of edible and non edible products.

The tappers were trained to use the tree climbers to climb the coconut and palmyrah trees. A handout in tamil was issued for the benefit of the tappers.
