Maha Ganapathy Trust, Coimbatore sponsored the free blood screening tests for about 150 people. CSC computer centre came forward in conducting the computer awareness programme for school children. Mr. Suresh, Assistant General Manager, NABARD highlighted the special schemes of Banks for rural development. The Directorate of Students' Welfare has organized the Job Fair 2008 during $3^{\text {td }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ May, 2008 at TNAU Main Campus. More than 600 Students of Agriculture, Horticulture, Agricultural Engineering, Forestry and Home Science from all the constituent colleges of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University participated in the fair. AgroBased companies and NGOs have participated in the Job Fair. At the beginning, Dr. M. Thangaraju, Director, Students' Welfare welcomed the company
executives and the students. He also explained about the three fold activities such as placement, Higher Education and Career Guidance to the participated companies, besides the technical know how and skills and field experience of the students.

Totally 432 students of Under Graduate and Post Graduate have been short-listed. Some companies have declared the results on the spot, while others wish to have one more screening. However, around 300 students
will get placements in these firms. The salary assured ranges from Rs. 8000 - Rs. 15,000 at UG level and Rs. 10,000-25,000 at PG level depending upon the nature of job and positions offered.

The above companies recruited the candidates for the positions of field officers, assistant managers for microfinance, quality control managers in export units, executives for customer care operations, marketing executives and scientists for research and development.


The Ministry of Water Resources, New Delhi sanctioned a scheme on Farmers Participatory Action Research Programme (FPARP) with a financial outlay of Rs. 35.0 lakhs to the Department of Agronomy, Agricultural College and Research Institute, Madurai. The Coastal Saline Research Centre, Ramanathapuram is implementing this technology demonstration programme as cooperating centre. One of the objectives of the scheme is to demonstrate the Mini Portable Sprinkler Irrigation Technology in 10 locations in the coastal sandy soils of Ramanathapuram District.

This technology is highly useful in an area of no electricity, use minimum amount of shallow fresh water avoiding sea water intrusion, possibility of saving $50 \%$ of the irrigation water requirement of crops and the farmers will also get assured crop without any loss in crop yield. This irrigation system can be profitably used for growing groundnut, onion, vegetables and greens in the coastal belt.

The entire technology demonstration programme is planned to carry out under farmers participatory mode wherein, the
farmers are formed into 10 groups consisting 5 farmers in each group. The mini portable sprinkler irrigation system will be given to the farmers group on free of cost alongwith the required seed and fertilizers for the first crop. The farmers will be asked to maintain the pumping system and it will be rotated among them on need basis. To mark the inauguration of this programme, Vice Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University presided and distributed the mini portable sprinkler irrigation systems to 10 groups of farmers at a function held at Perungulam Village, Ramanathapuram District on 09.05.2008. Dr.V.Ganesaraja, Professor and Head, Department of Agronomy, Madurai welcomed the gathering. Dr.S.Mahendran, Chief Scientist cum Principal Investigator explained about the various activities and importance of the scheme. The Director (WTC), the Dean, AC \& RI, the Dean, HSC \& RI, Madurai and the Joint Director of Agriculture, Ramanathapuram offered their felicitations. Dr.K.Srinivasan, Assoc. Professor and Head, CSRC, Ramanathapuram proposed a vote of thanks.

## TRAINING WORKSHOP ON INTEGRATED VEGETABLE GRAFTING TECHNOLOGY $\gg$



Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU), Coimbatore in collaboration with AVRDC The World vegetable centre, Taiwan and USAID supported IPM CRSP, Virginia Tech, Blacksburg, USA jointly organized a training on "Integrated vegetable grafting technology for managing soilborne diseases and increasing tolerance to flooding in the hotwet season" at Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, for three days from 7.5.2008 to 9.5 .2008 . The training was inaugurated on 7.05.2008 and was presided over by Dr.P.Balasubramanian, Director, Centre for Plant Molecular Biology (CPMB). Dr. R. Samiyappan, Director, Centre for Plant Protection Studies (CPPS), TNAU, Dr.E.A.Heinrichs, IPM

Consultant, Virginia Tech and Dr. Gregory C. Luther, AVRDC gave special addresses emphasizing the need and prospects achieved with the training in different countries. Mr. Deng-Lin, Principal Research Assistant, AVRDC, Dr. Heinrichs and Dr. Gregory C. Luther were the trainers.

A total of 32 farmers, including eighteen women farmers from different parts of Coimbatore and Dharmapuri district participated and benefited out the training. On day one, the farmers were trained to construct tunnel-type grafting chamber, which is the prerequisite for establishment of vegetable grafted seedlings using locally available materials. On day two, grafting technique was explained and practiced using protray raised seedlings of tomato,
brinjal, chillies, bitter gourd, bottle gourd, watermelon and pumpkin. The grafted seedlings were placed inside tunnel chamber for further observation. On day three, farmers made observation on grafted seedlings done by themselves. The trainees have been taken to the farmer's field at Theethipalayam village and the trainers explained the soil-borne bacterial and fungal disease diagnosis.

The training was concluded with distribution of participation certificates to the farmers. The training was a joint activity of Department of Plant Molecular Biology and Biotechnology and Department of Plant Pathology under the scheme "IPM CRSP Regional Research and Education for SouthAsia".

## NUTRIENT DISORDERS FORECAST IN ANAIMALAI BLOCK

Imbalanced plant nutrition and negative nutrient input-output balances often leads to significant soil nutrient depletion in irrigated rice growing areas.

Hence a study was taken up in the farmers' holdings of Anaimalai block to forecast the emerging nutrient disorders under farmers' practices of nutrient management.

Grain and straw yields of rice during kharif and rabi seasons were recorded in twenty farm sites under rice - rice cropping systems in Anaimalai block of Coimbatore district besides, collection of post harvest soil and plant samples for assessing the change in fertility. Nutrient balance in each farm was worked out by accounting nutrient inputs and outputs used to forecast the nutrient deficiency and sufficiency.

Nutrient balance studies after three years of rice cropping showed negative balance of all major nutrients regardless of soil type and management strategies. Except Zn and B , all other micronutrients were found in positive balance in heavy textured Anaimalai soil series, while in light textured lrugur and Palladam series, Zn and Cu were found in
