SMS Advisory Chances of light rain during 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7 July. Maximum temperature would be in the range of 35°C to 36°C and the minimum temperature would be between 25°C - 26°C. Generally cloudy sky will appear for the next five days. Wind is expected with the speed of 8-10 Kmph from, South & Southwest directions.

General Advisory:

Extended range Forecast for next week (05th to 11th July 2024):

Rainfall:

As per extended range predictions, there is possibility of slightly above normal rainfall likely over the district during 5th to 11th July 2024.

Maximum Temperature:

Maximum temperatures are likely to be generally normal and are likely to be in the range 26°C to 32°C over the plains of the district during next week. 5th to 11th July 2024.

Minimum Temperature:

Minimum temperatures are likely to be near normal and are likely to be in the range 20°C to 24°C over the district during next week 05th to 11th July 2024.

Weather Based Agro-Advisories: (Banana, Paddy & Animal Husbandry) Banana:

The incense of Panama Wilt is expected in Banana. The first obvious signs of disease are wilting and a light yellow colouring of the lower leaves. They eventually turn a bright yellow colour with dead leaf margins.

Remove and destroy infested plant parts after harvest. Grow healthy plants with proper fertilization, irrigation & weed control.

To control apply Pseudomonas fluorescens @ 2.5kg per ha. along with farmyard manure and apply Neem cake @ 250 Kg Per ha.

Paddy:

Biofertilizers enhance nutrient availability to plants, promote growth, and contribute to soil health.

Azospirillum, in particular, is known to fix nitrogen (up to 80 kg N/ha/season) and improve chlorophyll content and grain protein in paddy. These practices can reduce reliance on chemical fertilizers by up to 50%.

Prepare a solution of Azospirillum 1 kg per acre and Phosphobacteria or Azophos 1 kg per acre in 40 liters of water before planting and soak the roots of the paddy seedlings in the solution for 15 to 30 minutes before planting.

Animal Husbandry:

Goat rearing farmers are advised to prevent the goat from Tapeworm, which leads to mortality and weight loss.

Goats have to be de-wormed from July to September, contact the nearby veterinarian and provide deworming medicines to your goats.
