43rd Research council meeting



The 43rd Research Council meeting inaugurated the meeting. The Vicewas conducted on 4.3.2010. Our Vice-Chancellor, Dr. P. Murugesa Boopathi, chaired and

Chancellor in his presidential address informed that, under NADP. 224 automatic weather

stations were already installed in different blocks of Tamil Nadu, and another 161 will be installed during 2010-11 to monitor meteorological changes for forecasting of weather and pest incidence and for crop insurance. He further informed that. Anna (R) 4, a short duration saline resistant variety, has been released and in biotechnology, Bt brinjal varieties have been developed and in redgram, research is going on to develop varieties resistance to pod borer. He wanted that combined essential micronutrient mixtures be supplied to farmers for different crops and sub surface drip irrigation studies should be conducted in dry areas and precision farming in redgram be developed. He also stressed that liquid formulation of bio control agents be popularized among farmers and all the new technologies developed by the TNAU should be patented.

Final year B.Tech (Horticulture), PG and Ph.D students and the scientists of the Department of Agricultural Extension and Rural Sociology also attended the session.


Training on conservation agriculture


A twenty one day training programme on "Conservation Agriculture" was inaugurated at
