**B.S.**(Agribusiness Management) is another Under-Graduate programme with a vision to mould the students to become Agribusiness Managers in public and private financial institutions, Farm and plantation management, market and advertising, super and hyper markets, financial, insurance and product marketing, Procurement personnel, Human Resource Managers, Supply chain and logistic manager, Capital and commodity trading, Market Research and analysts and overseas employment in Asia -Pacific region.

impacts made the issue of mitigating global warming an important mission.

Dr.C.Ramasamy, Vice-Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, in his presidential address stressed that the country should have an exclusive national body to control climate change. He said that stabilization of emission is possible but involves huge investments where in policy makers, politicians, scientists, farmers, students and the public should join hands to tackle this global problem.

Mr.B.Siddarthan, Advisor, Norwegian Embassy in his special address indicated that Agricultural Scientists alone cannot solve the problems arising out of global warming, as climate change is a global issue and he made an appeal for congregation of scientists form different areas like Agriculture, meteorology and Geology to work out a solution for climate change.

Rural industries Minister Th.Pongalur N.Palanisamy launched the Automatic Weather Station installed by TNAU at 45 locations over Tamil Nadu in collaboration with Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) and emphasized that the issue of global warming was the immediate need of the hour.

Dr.P.G.Chengappa, Vice-Chancellor, University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore in his address during the inaugural function cautioned the farmers to stop burning crops, particularly sugarcane, since such activity would increase the green house gas concentration in the atmosphere. He suggested technological options like aerobic paddy, bio-fuels and aerosol-free disposal of biomass, as alternatives that could bring down the level of global warming.

Prof.M.C.Varshneya, Vice-Chancellor, Anand Agricultural University, Gujarat cautioned that the climate change should be viewed as a serious issue and all sectors should take care to reduce the emission levels.

There were five technical sessions covering various topics viz., Climate change assessments and projections, Climate change impacts on agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, fisheries, hydrology, forestry and ecology, Climate change adaptation for agriculture, Climate change mitigation and Energy options. An exclusive session was organized for the students to interact with the scientists of Climatology, Meteorology, Geology, Agriculture and other disciplines. There were eight invited talks, 14 lead talks and 20 oral presentations and 84 poster cum short oral presentation were made in the conference covering the conference themes.

## TRAINING ON PULSES, VEGETABLES AND AGRI ENTERPRISES

At Tamil Nadu Rice Research Institute, Aduthurai a two day training on 'Rice, pulses, vegetable cultivation technologies and agrienterprises' was organized on 28.08.07 and 29.08.07. Farmers

In all, 41 coconut gardens in the above five taluks were visited. Only two trees with typical symptoms of the new disease were observed during the survey, one tree at Edayakadu village (Madukkur



block) and another tree at Thonthupulikadu village (Peravurani block).

## PROFITABLE CASTOR CULTIVATION INTIRUNELVELI

One day seminar on 'Profitable Castor Cultivation' was organized at Tirunelveli on 27.8.07 by the scientist of Tapioca and Castor Research Station, Yethapur. About 64 farmers from Tirunelveli and

Tuticorin districts and 15 agricultural field officers of Mother India Agro Farms Pvt. Ltd participated in the seminar. The seminar motivated the farmers to go for hybrid castor cultivation. Because of higher net profit realized in castor cultivation coupled with low water requirement of castor crop, hybrid castor cultivation is a boon to dryland and to the areas with limited irrigation potential.
