Government of India sponsored Model Training Course "Information and Communication Technology in Agriculture" Inaugurated

Government of India sponsored Model Training Course on "Information and Communication Technology in Agriculture" was inaugurated e-Extension Centre, Directorate of Extension Education, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU), Coimbatore on 20-10-2016. About 20 participants from Development Departments like Agriculture, Horticulture, Sericulture and Seed Certification participated in the training programme. Which will be conducted from 20-10-2016 to 27-10-2016 (8 days).

Dr. K.
