37<sup>th</sup> Centre for Advanced Faculty Training in Agronomy on "Advanced Agro techniques and Agronomic interventions for Doubling Farmers income" is being organized at the Department of Agronomy, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore will be held from 28<sup>th</sup> November to 18<sup>th</sup> December, 2019. Achieving this goal will reduce persistent disparity between farm and non-farm income, alleviate agrarian distress, promote inclusive growth and infuse dynamism in the agriculture sector. Respectable income in farm sector also attract youth towards farming profession and ease the pressure on non-farm job which are not growing as per the expectations. There are two possible way to increase the farmers income that, we have to increase the productivity of the crops or increase the farmers has to get higher price for his produce.

Dr.V.Geethalakshmi, Director, Directorate of Crop Management delivered her address and narrated the problems faced in the agricultural sectors especially in the areas of climate change, soil health etc., She has stressed to utilize the advanced technologies developed by the different agricultural scientists to mitigate the problems and improve the income of the farming community. She also indicated the programme on Doubling farmers income organized by Tamil Nadu Agricultural University at Kinathukadavu areas.
