Melia Park Established in Agri Varsity

Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU) Department of Farm Management and National Service Scheme jointly established Melia Park with 760 tree saplings popularly known as Malivembu in Tamil planted by NSS volunteers on Apr. 27, 2015.

Each volunteers is vested with responsibility of maintaining 2 trees. Government and youth affairs ministry plans to organize "Own your tree" programme. The programme is initiated in the Agri varsity.

The programme was inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor Dr. K.
